RULES:

1. Exhibitors are asked to follow directions as to the number of BLOOMS, COLOURS, etc. Failure to do so can disqualify entry. (Note: A BUD SHOWING COLOUR SHALL COUNT AS A BLOOM). Cedar or saran wrap may be used to keep blooms in place in container but must not show.
2. Exhibitors may make ONE entry ONLY in any one class, unless otherwise stated.
3. Decision of Judge(s) is final.
4. No exhibitor will be awarded a prize unless, in the Judge's opinion, it possesses sufficient merit, even though it may be the only entry in its class.
5. Judging will be done according to the New Ontario Judging & Exhibiting Standards Publication #34/2003.
6. The Show Committee has authority to add a special class in any show, if there are sufficient entries to warrant after the entry time is closed.
7. All Exhibitors are responsible for proper placement. It is the responsibility of the Exhibitor to have entries properly tagged and placed in the correct classes. Failure to do so may result in disqualification of entry.
8. Remember to groom your plants and have them free of insects before bringing them to the show or they will be disqualified and removed from show.
9. ONLY the Flower Show Committee is allowed to be in the area during judging.
10. AWARDS MAY ONLY BE WON 2 YEARS IN A ROW.
11. Name flowers if possible.

Cut Flowers From Your Garden

DEFINITION:

a 'container' should be the same flower, same colour;
a 'collection' should be a variety of colours & a variety of specimens

1. A **collection** of summer/fall flowers, not to exceed 15 stems displayed in a container and suitably arranged. **Lorraine Piggott Memorial Award**
2. A **collection** of Asters suitably arranged not to exceed 8 stems
3. Begonia - Tuberous, 1 floating with own foliage.
4. Coleus - 3 stems, any variety
5. Chrysanthemums - 3 stems, any specimen
6. A **collection** of Chrysanthemums - not to exceed 6 stems
7. Daisies – a **container** of any daisy type flower not to exceed 6 stems
8. Dahlia - 3” & over, 3 blooms, foliage attached
9. Dahlia – 1” – 3”, 3 blooms, foliage attached
10. A **collection** of Dahlias suitably arranged not to exceed 9 stems

11. Geranium - 3 heads, one colour with own foliage
12. Geranium - 3 heads, mixed colours with own foliage
13. Cosmos - 5 stems with foliage attached
14. Sunflower - 3 blooms

Gladioli - a 20” limit on length of stem below bottom floret

15. Gladiolus – 1 spike any colour. No entry limit if different colour
16. Gladiolus - 3 spikes, mixed colours.
17. A collection of grasses and suitably arranged, not to exceed 9 stems
18. A collection of hosta leaves suitably arranged, not to exceed 5 stems
19. Marigolds - large, 3 blooms, over 3”
20. Marigolds - medium, 3 blooms, 2”-3”
21. Marigolds - 3 blooms, under 2”
22. Marigolds - Miniature, 3 blooms, under 1”
23. A **collection** of marigolds suitably arranged not to exceed 9 stems

24. **NEW** – Canna Lily – 3 stems, foliage attached
25. **NEW** – Calla Lily – 3 stems, foliage attached, not to exceed 25”
26. Pansies and/or Violas - with own foliage
27. A **collection** of Petunias - suitably arranged, not to exceed 9 stems
28. **NEW** – Lavender – 9 stems. Name variety if possible

In categories 29 - 37, name your roses, if possible

29. Rose- Hybrid Tea, any colour, **Ruth Jensen Memorial Award**
30. Rose - Floribunda, 1 spray, any colour
31. Rose - 1 spray, any other variety, not listed
32. Rose - 1 bloom floating, with own foliage
33. Rose - Miniature, 1 spray, any colour
34. Rose - Miniature, 1 bloom floating, with own foliage
35. Rose - Miniature, 1 bloom, any colour
36. A **collection** of Roses - suitably arranged, not to exceed 7 stems
37. Rose - Most Fragrant

38. A **collection** of foliage - suitably arranged, not to exceed 9 stems
39. Salvia variety of colours suitably arranged not to exceed 7 stems
40. Zinnia - 3 blooms, Pompon, under 2”
41. Zinnia - 3 blooms, Cactus

42. Zinnia - 3 blooms, decorative
 43. Zinnias - A **collection** suitably arranged, not to exceed 6 stems variety

 NOTE: when cutting Zinnia ends they should be burned or scalded

45. **NEW** – Nicotiana displayed in a container 5 stems
 46. Sedum – a **collection** not to exceed 5 stems

47. Sedum – any one colour, 3 stems
 48. Hydrangea – 3 stems
 49. Any other Annual NOT listed above. Not more than 3 blooms, stems or spikes per entry. Please name flower if possible
 50. Any other Perennial NOT listed above. Not more than 3 blooms, stems or spikes per entry.

Potted Plants

Plants must be owned by exhibitor for three months prior to show. One Entry per exhibitor in each class. Pots and saucers must be cleaned and plants must be groomed.

51. Bonsai Plant

52. Herb Planter – pot not to exceed 10". Please name.
 53. Variegated foliage plant
 54. Begonia - Fancy leaf, houseplant
 55. Begonia - any flowering variety
 56. Coleus - 1 variety, must be grown in pot
 57. Cactus - Pot not to exceed 4"
 58. Cactus - Pot over 4" must be in bloom
 59. Succulent - Pot not to exceed 4"
 60. Succulent - Pot over 4"
 61. Cactus &/or Succulent Garden - Pot or tray containing a variety of cactus and/or succulents. Not to exceed 15" in diameter
 62. A plant trained on a trellis or form. Non-hanging
 63. Geranium - 1 variety, must be in bloom
 64. Mixed Pot – Flowering Annual, must be in bloom, non-hanging
 65. Impatiens – 1 plant or more in bloom, non-hanging
 66. Orchid – any type, in bloom

67. Most unusual or odd houseplant
 68. Any other flowering houseplant, not listed above. Must be in bloom & named

70. Hanging plant – Flowering - must be in bloom & equipped to hang
71. Hanging plant - Non-Flowering - equipped to hang
72. Fern – any type – pot, not to exceed 10"
73. Mixed hanging pot, not to exceed 10"

Artistic Designs

Prize money: 1st \$6.00; 2nd \$5.00; 3rd \$3.00

RULES:

All Artistic Designs must be complete when brought to show. **ONCE THE DESIGNS ARE ON THE TABLE, NO ONE IS ALLOWED TO MOVE THEM.**

Entry tags should not be attached to arrangement. Place tags on table

All flowers in design must be garden grown (yours, friends, neighbours) **not store purchased** unless stated.

All designs to be your interpretation, unless otherwise stated. Accessories permitted.

74. **'GARDEN FEAST'** – arrangement of flowers & accessories using a vegetable or fruit as a container
75. **'CELEBRATION'** – Christmas table arrangement include candles
76. **'GEORGIAN BAY REFLECTIONS'** – using 2/3 water as a part of the design, accessories permitted
77. **'SONG OF PINES'** – a design using pine greens featuring MUMS
78. **'THANKSGIVING WREATH'** – not to exceed 20" diameter, commercial material may be used
79. **'SWEETER THAN WINE'** – design in a wine glass
80. **'REACH FOR THE STARS'** – a vertical design not to exceed 28"
81. **'MINI MAGIC'** – a miniature arrangement not to exceed 5" in any direction
82. **'SNOW & ICE'** – design white flowers, glitter may be used
83. **'COWBOYS & COWGIRLS'** – a tribute to the Coldwater Fair Board, a design depicting motion, accessories allowed
